

AGE/SEX

In April 2011 this area had a population of 4,551, consisting of 2,226 males and 2,325 females.

The population of pre-school age (0-4) was 678, of primary school going age (5-12) was 507 and of secondary school going age (13-18) was 223. There were 178 persons aged 65 years and over. The number of persons aged 18 years or over was 3,176.

MARITAL STATUS

Of the 3,290 persons aged 15 years and over, 1,367 were single, 1,683 were married, 93 were separated, 89 were divorced and 58 were widowed.

LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

There were 1,650 private households in this area in April 2011, of which 317 were single person households. Of the 1,261 families in the area, 352 were couples with no children. The average number of children per family was 1.3 compared with 1.4 nationally.

MIGRATION AND NATIONALITIES

90.0 per cent of the usually resident population aged over 1 lived at the same address one year before the census. A further 8.5 per cent lived elsewhere in the same county, 0.7 per cent lived elsewhere in the State while 0.8 per cent lived outside the State twelve months before the census on April 10, 2011.

Non-Irish nationals accounted for 22.1 per cent of the population of this area compared with a national average figure of 12.0 per cent. Polish (451 persons) were the largest group, followed by Nigerians (110 persons).

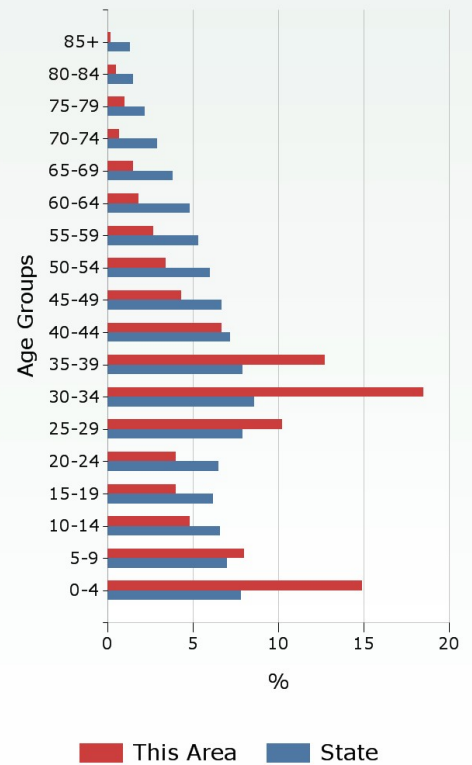
LANGUAGES

1,578 persons could speak the Irish language and of these 537 spoke the language daily. 1,008 persons spoke a language other than Irish or English at home and of these 145 could not speak English well or at all. Polish was the most common foreign language spoken at home with 462 speakers.

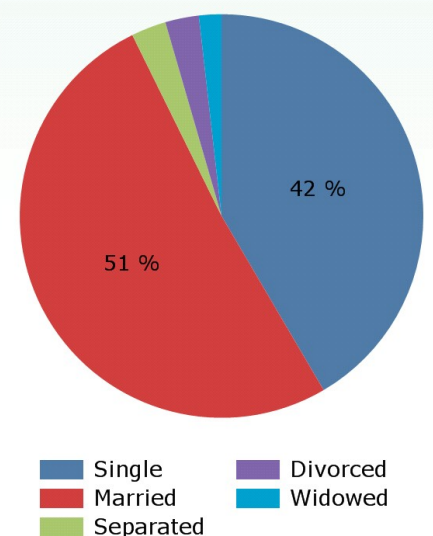
RELIGION

There were 3,697 Roman Catholics in the area at census time. A further 551 were adherents of other stated religions (e.g. Church of Ireland, Islam, Presbyterian, Orthodox), while 226 persons indicated that they had no religion.

LABOUR FORCE

There were 2,558 persons aged 15 years and over in the labour force and of these, 84.6 per cent (2,163 persons) were at work. The unemployment rate for this area was 15.4 per cent compared with a national average rate of 19.0 per cent.

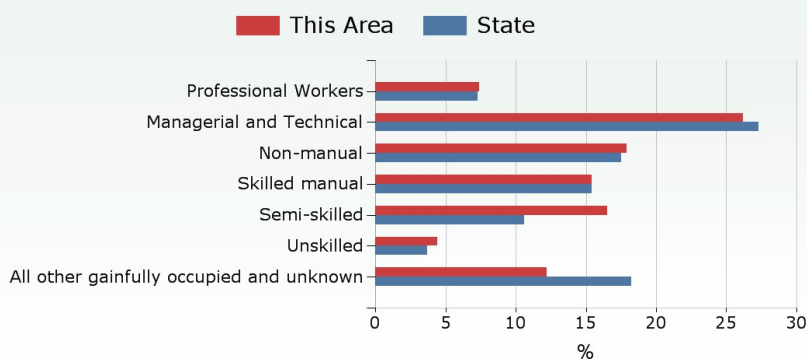
Of the 732 persons aged 15 years and over who were outside the labour force, 34.4 per cent were students, 30.9 per cent were looking after the home/family and 21.6 per cent were retired.

Of the 2,163 workers enumerated in this area, 1,696 worked outside the area. The daytime working population (resident and non-resident) of this area was 694 with commerce and trade being the largest industry.

EDUCATION

Of those aged 15 years and over whose full-time education had ceased, 7.1 per cent were educated to at most primary level only; a further 55.4 per cent attained second level while 37.6 per cent were educated to third level.

TRAVEL TO WORK

The most popular means of travelling to work was by car (driver) with this mode accounting for 75.6 per cent of all journeys. 81 persons commuted using public transport (bus or rail). The average journey time was 23 minutes and 13.8 per cent of workers faced a commuting time in excess of 30 minutes.

DISABILITY AND CARERS

390 persons had a disability in April 2011, of whom 77, representing 19.7 per cent of the total, were aged 65 years and over.

146 persons (56 males and 90 females) provided regular unpaid personal help for a friend or family member with a long-term illness, health problem or disability. 19.2 per cent of these provided care for more than 6 hours per day.

HOUSING, INTERNET AND CARS

88.5 per cent of households lived in houses or bungalows while a further 11.5 per cent lived in apartments, flats or bedsits. 1,066 dwellings (64.6 per cent) were owner occupied while 562 dwellings (34.1 per cent) were rented. 67.3 per cent of the dwellings in this area were built in the ten years before the census. The average number of persons per household was 2.8 compared with 2.7 nationally.

73.6 per cent of households had broadband connectivity compared with 63.8 per cent nationally. 49.2 per cent of households had two or more cars.

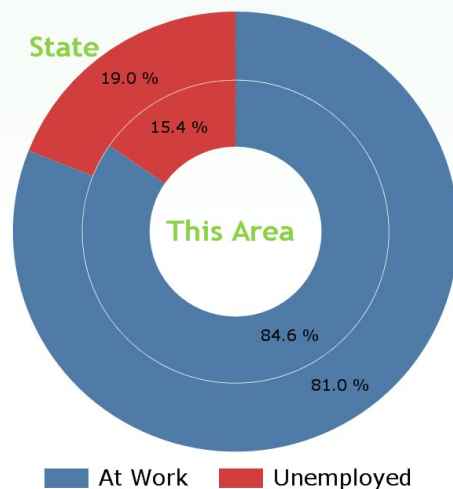
GENERAL HEALTH

In this area 4,191 persons stated they were in very good or good health, representing 92.1 per cent of total persons. This compares to 88.3 per cent of total persons nationally. 31 persons stated they were in bad or very bad health, representing 0.7 per cent of total persons in this area. Again this compares with 1.5 per cent of total persons nationally.
