

AGE/SEX

In April 2011 Clane had a population of 6,702, consisting of 3,292 males and 3,410 females.

The population of pre-school age (0-4) was 708, of primary school going age (5-12) was 829 and of secondary school going age (13-18) was 499. There were 378 persons aged 65 years and over. The number of persons aged 18 years or over was 4,746.

MARITAL STATUS

Of the 4,975 persons aged 15 years and over, 1,988 were single, 2,478 were married, 206 were separated, 126 were divorced and 177 were widowed.

LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

There were 2,405 private households in Clane in April 2011, of which 495 were single person households. Of the 1,845 families in the area, 533 were couples with no children. The average number of children per family was 1.3 compared with 1.4 nationally.

MIGRATION AND NATIONALITIES

90.8 per cent of the usually resident population aged over 1 lived at the same address one year before the census. A further 6.5 per cent lived elsewhere in the same county, 1.9 per cent lived elsewhere in the State while 0.8 per cent lived outside the State twelve months before the census on April 10, 2011.

Non-Irish nationals accounted for 15.6 per cent of the population of Clane compared with a national average figure of 12.0 per cent. Polish (339 persons) were the largest group, followed by UK nationals (183 persons).

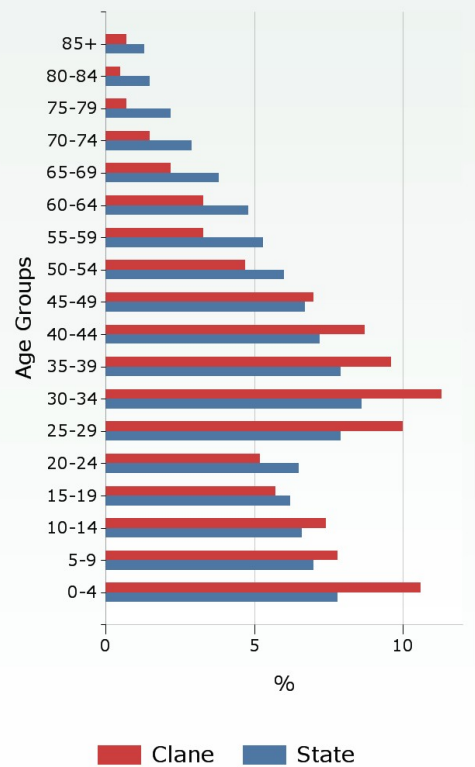
LANGUAGES

2,565 persons could speak the Irish language and of these 880 spoke the language daily. 984 persons spoke a language other than Irish or English at home and of these 201 could not speak English well or at all. Polish was the most common foreign language spoken at home with 336 speakers.

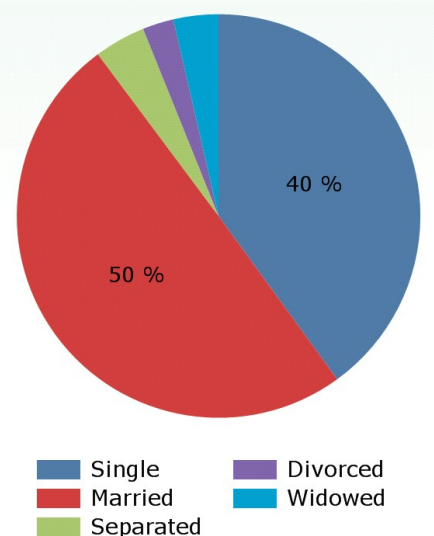
RELIGION

There were 5,699 Roman Catholics in the area at census time. A further 532 were adherents of other stated religions (e.g. Church of Ireland, Islam, Presbyterian, Orthodox), while 400 persons indicated that they had no religion.

LABOUR FORCE

There were 3,609 persons aged 15 years and over in the labour force and of these, 83.4 per cent (3,009 persons) were at work. The unemployment rate for this area was 16.6 per cent compared with a national average rate of 19.0 per cent.

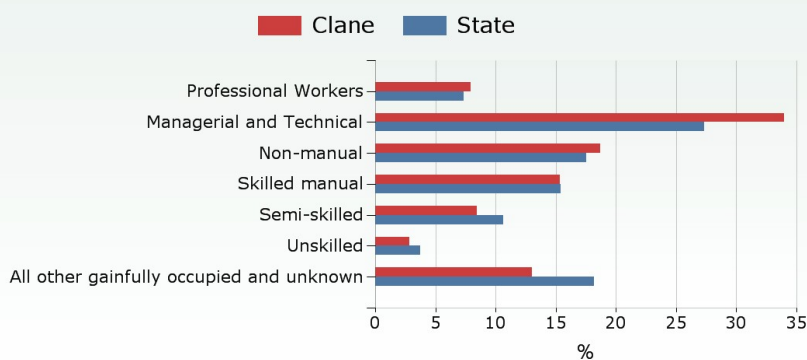
Of the 1,366 persons aged 15 years and over who were outside the labour force, 33.2 per cent were students, 31.4 per cent were looking after the home/family and 23.9 per cent were retired.

Of the 3,009 workers enumerated in Clane, 2,192 worked outside the area. The daytime working population (resident and non-resident) of Clane was 1,111 with professional services being the largest industry.

EDUCATION

Of those aged 15 years and over whose full-time education had ceased, 8.6 per cent were educated to at most primary level only; a further 53.0 per cent attained second level while 38.4 per cent were educated to third level.

TRAVEL TO WORK

The most popular means of travelling to work was by car (driver) with this mode accounting for 71.7 per cent of all journeys. 234 persons commuted using public transport (bus or rail). The average journey time was 33 minutes and 40.3 per cent of workers faced a commuting time in excess of 30 minutes.

DISABILITY AND CARERS

673 persons had a disability in April 2011, of whom 150, representing 22.3 per cent of the total, were aged 65 years and over.

198 persons (75 males and 123 females) provided regular unpaid personal help for a friend or family member with a long-term illness, health problem or disability. 21.2 per cent of these provided care for more than 6 hours per day.

HOUSING, INTERNET AND CARS

76.9 per cent of households lived in houses or bungalows while a further 23.1 per cent lived in apartments, flats or bedsits. 1,649 dwellings (68.6 per cent) were owner occupied while 734 dwellings (30.5 per cent) were rented. 41.6 per cent of the dwellings in this area were built in the ten years before the census. The average number of persons per household was 2.8 compared with 2.7 nationally.

78.5 per cent of households had broadband connectivity compared with 63.8 per cent nationally. 50.1 per cent of households had two or more cars.

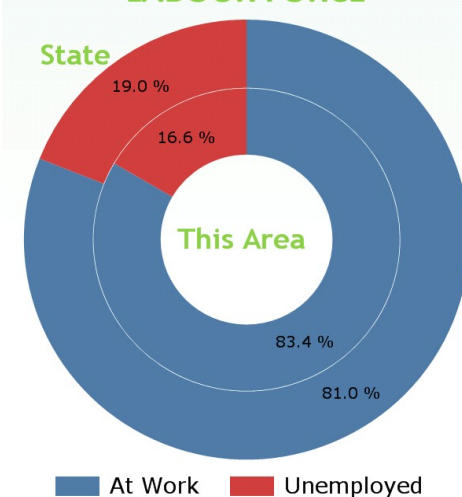
GENERAL HEALTH

In this area 6,123 persons stated they were in very good or good health, representing 91.4 per cent of total persons. This compares to 88.3 per cent of total persons nationally. 65 persons stated they were in bad or very bad health, representing 1.0 per cent of total persons in this area. Again this compares with 1.5 per cent of total persons nationally.
